## Clematis 'Tie Dye'

- New color pattern for clematis; bright purple flowers with pale lavender to white marbling that starts in the center of each petal and feathers out to the edges
- Blooms only on the current year's growth. Plants should be cut back in early spring to two strong sets of buds on each stem as close to ground level as possible. This will provide a plant with blooms that start near ground level and continue to the top
